

How To Take A Good Portrait

A good portrait draws attention to the subject. This is achieved by a shallow depth of field, composition, color, and lighting.

Engage with your subject

You want your camera to be level or slightly above the model's eyeline. Do not shoot from a low angle.

You should take around 50 photos. Try to capture the in-between moments.

When framing your shot don't cut off any of the model's limbs.

Even lighting takes your portrait to the next level.

When it's time to shoot put your camera in aperture priority mode.
Aperture= $f/1.8 - f/2$.
Shutter speed= $1/100$ th of sec
ISO=low
